Once I feel that I understand the parties' positions well enough to comment intelligently, I will discuss those positions with each party to foster the party's understanding of the strengths and weaknesses of its case and of the case of its adversary. I then assist each party in performing a sober evaluation of the dispute and assist the parties in negotiating toward a mutually acceptable resolution. I also attempt to ferret out any subordinate issues which will be important in any settlement to ensure they are addressed in the parties' settlement agreement.
