I believe that it is critical to listen to what the parties are saying and what they are not saying. When appropriate, I will propose solutions to problems. When appropriate, I will confidentially evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of parties' positions when in caucus. I will mediate in both in person and via videoconference. I am comfortable with the technology. I generally do not request hard copies of documents or submissions- electronic files are fine.
